Mr. David Lintz is the Director of Red Men Museum and Library in Waco. He has been in the museum field for over 40 years, 29 of which he spent at the Strecker Museum Complex at Baylor University.

Mrs. Claire Masters is the author of "Selections From Portals to the Past." She has served HWF in many ways including her work as the Curator of the Heritage Collection, installing over 29 exhibits.

Dr. Karen Pope is a Senior Lecturer in Art History at Baylor University. She is dedicated to educating students of all ages about art history as she has led lectures and trips around the U.S. and Europe.
